in celebration assembly this week. We had lots of children receiving their coloured certificates today and some children receiving their PROUD certificates.









We also had pupils celebrated for achievements in dancing and Beavers.

## Science at Place Farm



In Early Years they have been focusing on 'Ourselves', they have been comparing the human body to animals and looking at similarities and differences. The book they focused on was 'The Same but different too'.


In Rainbow Class they have been focussing on living things: How do you know if it's alive? What a plant/animal needs to live. (MRS GREN) They have been on nature walks around school to find habitats and micro habitats and taken photos to evidence this, and drawn their own minibeasts in the deadwood habitat.


In Year One they have been looking at different types of plants: wild plants and will soon be moving on to garden plants. They went out and explored the outdoor area to see what they could find.





In Year Two they have been focusing on MRS GREN – movement, respiration, sensitivity, growth, reproduction, excretion and nutrition





In Year Three they have been learning about Rocks and the different types.

They have enjoyed carrying out different experiments to test to see if the rock is limestone using an acid and they have explored different soils too.






In Year Four they have been learning about Living thing and their habitats and they have been using classification in their work.





In Year five they have been focusing on Properties and changes of materials. Looking at separating materials from one another. Most recently, looking at reversible changes such as, melting and freezing and evaporating and condensation.





In Year Six, they have just started a new unit on 'Animal including humans - The Circulatory System'.

The first lesson was all about what is blood made up of. The children discussed the different components and what their role is. They will be moving on to looking at what makes up the circulatory system and how blood is transported around the body!

#### Booking Process / Eequ

We will be continuing to use the Eequ booking platform this holiday. There are no longer voucher codes. All bookings will now go through the **Eequ** system and a verification check before they are confirmed.

Parents will need to select their eligibility criteria when booking.

- Parents will book their children through the online links using Eequ if their child meets the criteria, they will
  get approval and will receive a confirmation email.
- If they are rejected, they will receive a cancellation and explanation of why encourage families to log into Eequ regularly to check their messaged as well as their junk email folder
- Parents need to understand their booking is not confirmed and they are not eligible for a place until they
  have received their booking confirmation email.
