Year 5 Museum Trip

On Wednesday 26th March, Year Five went to Cambridge to explore the Zoology Museum and the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology. We were all impeccably behaved and represented Place Farm beautifully.

At the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology we met Rob who spoke to us about the Maya civilisation and showed us a large replica of a Maya Stelae. This showed us a Maya King. We split into two groups and took turns to explore the museum, searching for Maya artefacts and completing activities about these. The other group worked with Rob handling some genuine Maya artefacts as well as some replicas. We were asked to try and identify the artefact and what it might be used for. We did very well with this!



















Wildlife Club Spring Round Up

This half-term, Wildlife Club members have had a go at being mini-meterologists and learnt about different cloud formations, using an overlay to spot them in the sky and then draw them. Generally, we have really enjoyed getting out and about more with a Spring spotter sheet and more planting. <u>EYFS</u> disco will run during the school day from 2:30pm until 3:00pm. EYFS pupils can wear non-uniform for this day. Tickets cost £2 and will include a glow stick and ring light.

Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 disco will run from 3:30pm-4:45pm. Pupils can bring party clothes to school to change into before the disco. Tickets will cost £3.50 and will include a snack. Please collect your child from the playground at 4:45pm. They will exit from their usual classrooms.

Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 disco will run from 5:00pm- 6:15pm. Tickets cost £3.50 and will include a snack. Pupils will enter the disco via the front gate near the office and exit from their classrooms onto the playground on Crowland Road. Pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 who can walk home alone will need to let the class teacher know in advance that they have permission.


