Keep Safe Month at Place Farm Primary Academy

This month, the children have been completing various activities linked to keeping safe.

As part of our Belonging strategy, the children each designed a belonging biscuit. One design was chosen to be printed onto the biscuits for every school in the trust. On Thursday, the children all took part in eating a belonging biscuit together on the playground.



An activity that the children took part in was that they drew their own worldview journey shaped by their own individual background, family, and cultural influence. We shared these to see how we all have similarities and differences.



The children may have completed a PoEd lesson about understanding the law or they might have completed a PSHE association lesson about keeping safe at home and understanding personal boundaries.

They explored what is meant by 'personal space' and 'personal boundaries' and why these are important. They learnt about how boundaries might be different for different people. Keeping safe at home was all about identifying some common hazards that might occur in the home and suggest some actions that they can take to help minimise the risk of accidents happening at home.

We also had a visit from Rachel the PCSO discussing different topics. The children all loved asking her questions about the laws.



Year Four West Stow Trip

On Friday 28th March, Year Four went to West Stow to explore the Anglo-Saxon Village.

Whilst we were there, the children were able to handle replica objects and play a 'guess the object game'. We were very good at guessing! We also spent some time looking around the Museum, we saw lots of artefacts which we could link in to our learning at school. The children thoroughly enjoyed meeting West Stow's 2 resident boars Apple and Acom. In the afternoon, we spent some time looking around all the huts and seeing how the Anglo-Saxons lived. We even came across a carpenter carving a canoe out of wood.

The children were all very well behaved and thoroughly enjoyed the activities throughout the day. They were very inquisitive and asked lots of great questions!



Year Four St Mary's Church Visit

The children had a great time visiting St Mary's Church on Monday. They enjoyed exploring a variety of activities linked to Easter. The activities included: re-enacting The Last Supper and creating a garden display of items that make them feel safe. |



Year 6 trip to Cambridge Central Mosque

Year Six had a fantastic day at the Mosque yesterday. We had a super, informative tour where we all learnt lots of new information about Islam. The children were able to answer some questions from the tour guide using their great knowledge, which they had learnt at school. We learnt that it is an eco-Mosque and is mostly made of wood. We learnt about the different prayer times which are shown on the clocks inside the Mosque and we entered the prayer hall where particular symbols and patterns were pointed out to us. The children behaved so well as always and we are so proud of them.



Year One 'Our Animal World' visit

The children thoroughly enjoyed their opportunity to meet the animals and share their knowledge of what they have learned in their science lessons. They all braved the chance to experience close encounters with different creatures such as a bearded dragon, snake, salamander, millepede, tortoise, hedgehog, birds, guinea pigs and stick insect.

We had a wonderful Reading Café for 5ML on Thursday, it was super! The children and their siblings enjoyed reading some lovely books with their grown-ups in our cosy setting.

Our children love inviting you in to share stories with them. Thank you to everyone that has joined us so far, and we look forward to seeing more of you each week.

ECO NEWS!

Welcome to the Eco Warriors and sustainability team newsletter.

This last term has been a whirlwind of activity.

New laws have come into force that all schools must be recycling by March 31st including food waste. This was our mission already so we were a little ahead of the game!

We have had food bins and caddies delivered and EYFS-Year 2 now have these in class, and you may see brown food bins dotted around School. These are being used well by the children and kitchen and we are well on our way.



We also had blue recycling bins for all classrooms delivered these include paper and clean hard plastics like bottles. Slowly we have started to get used to using these and our general waste is already down. The children and I have figured out a brilliant and easy schedule for emptying the bins and the EW team have been so proactive and eager to empty these each week. The feedback has been good all round and we are starting to iron out any tweaks to

make it all work smoothly. Thanks to the cleaning staff and children as well as teachers and staff for all your help with this productive and necessary move!



We have also been working on keeping power and energy use down as well as conserving heating. Our first move was to get the doors to remain closed where heat was leaking out. The posters we were given by Chris Bryant, who visited us to talk about this, were perfect and have worked a treat and EW are on duty to shut any doors that haven't been closed. This has

helped us keep warm inside and allowed us to decrease the heating and time that it is on. As we move into the warmer (consistently!) months we will have the heating off altogether and will be focussing more on keeping electricity use down. KS2 will be learning how to use

a website provided to Schools to aid in this and there will be other important activities coming up too!

This Friday we have been part of the 'Big Clean Up' project in which we pledge that we will collect bags of rubbish from our local areas. We have used the litter pickers across the school, as we often do, and this will continue as an ongoing target of ours into Summer 1. Remember if you want to help clean up YOUR local area: litter pickers can be borrowed over the weekend and collected after School on a Friday from rainbow class. If children aren't sure where that is, ask your teacher and I can pop one to you.



Finally, a massive thank you to every one of you who donated to and purchased from our White elephant stall – the money we raised went straight into the recycling project and we are so pleased with what we have been able to do. We will also be launching the BIG BATTERY HUNT again in Summer 2 but with a twist. Keep an eye out for more on that, but save any USED batteries for Summer 1.


