


#### Rainbow Reading Café

Thank you to everyone who has supported our Reading Cafes, and we look forward to seeing more of you very soon 😊












#### History at Place Farm


Please see a little snapshot into the History learning that has been taking place in Years 1-6 over the spring term. There are some images of work as well as some quotes from the children about their history learning.

#### Year 1




"I enjoy learning about Mary Anning. She found lots of fossils. We had fossils in our class which helped us to understand it more."

"History is one of my favourite subjects as it's so interesting."




#### Year 2




"I liked learning about the Great Fire of London and how it started."

"We got to dress up and had a Great Fire of London Day."







"We learnt about the different stages within the Stone Age."

"The Mayan's has been my favourite history topic this year because it is very interesting how they used symbols and pictures to communicate."






## Geography at Place Farm


#### Year 1

In Year One the children have been exploring the equator and what the weather is like there.




## <u>Year 2 & Rainbow</u>

In Year Two, they have been the Yanomami people in the Amazon rainforest. Exploring what life is like for them and how they live.




In Year Three, the children have challenged themselves with their human and physical features and exploring different landmarks across the UK.



## Year 4


In Year Four, they have dived deeper into the countries Egypt and Greece and where they are in the world.




In Year Five, the children were looking at grid references alongside maps.
