The children in all year's groups have been working hard in their science lessons. It has been lovely to see what the children have been learning in the school.

In Early Years their half termly focus has been 'Animals'. They were all went to Boydells Dairy Farm and enjoyed seeing the farm animals and taking part in real life experiences, such as feeding the animals, holding and petting them and also finding out facts about them. They have also been focusing on Life cycles, animal features, habitats, the different things animals eat, carnivores, herbivores, omnivores and nocturnal animals.





Year One – Have been focusing on materials. They have been busy carrying out experiments and finding out which ones are waterproof and which ones are not.



Year two – Have been focusing on Plants and what they need to be healthy and thrive. The children have been involved in many experiments, predicting what they think may happen and evaluating their findings. The children are all working hard to remember the key scientific vocabulary and what it means.









Year three – Have been focusing on light. They have been making shadows and looking at how light affects them.



Year four – have been focusing on circuits and electricity. The have been looking at what uses electricity through the mains or batteries as well as open and closed circuits.



Year five- have been focusing on lifecycles and what happens at each stage.






Year six- have been learning about the circulatory system the children have been working hard to use their scientific vocabulary within the lessons.

They have just moved on to learning about water transportation and have been exploring how the circulatory system and the digestive system are connected.

The children have enjoyed creating their own input and output machines to illustrate how what is eaten can affect the circulatory system.

and asked lots of exciting questions.














Year 2 parents - are you ready for September?

Your child will no longer receive Universal Infant Free School Meals when they move to Year 3 unless you **apply now** and are eligible.

You will save over £435 a year and your child's school will receive extra funding to support your child with their learning.

If you have already applied and have been found to be eligible, you do not need to reapply.

To be eligible for Free School Meals you must receive one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- · Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.
- · Working Tax Credit 4 week run on
