- Helping children whose speech is hard to understand.



Breakfast and Afterschool Club

We provide a welcoming environment for children – who attend Place Farm Primary - from EYFS to Year Six. We offer the children a wide range of stimulating activities planned for enjoyment and relaxation with the opportunities to develop new friendship and skills.

The activities are planned with the children and their ideas and wishes are included where possible. Activities are also adapted to suit the needs of the children so that they can access them.

Snack is available in Afterschool Club at a cost of £1.00 per child, per session. This is provided by the school kitchen.

Money for snack should be put in a named envelope and given to Mrs. Polley, Mrs. Hobbs or the class teacher, where possible, at the beginning of the week.

Orders for snack are given to the kitchen staff each day at lunch time, so they can be prepared for the end of the day.

Children can bring their own snack and drink, if parents should prefer.
